- 1 (d) A health maintenance organization shall permit a provider a minimum of 6 2 months from the date a covered service is rendered to submit a claim for 3 reimbursement for the service.
- 4 (e) (1) If a health maintenance organization notifies a provider that 5 additional documentation is necessary to adjudicate a claim, the health maintenance 6 organization shall reimburse the provider for covered services within 30 days after 7 receipt of all reasonable and necessary documentation.
- 8 (2) If a health maintenance organization fails to comply with the 9 requirements of paragraph (1) of this subsection, the health maintenance 10 organization shall pay interest in accordance with the requirements of subsection (b) 11 of this section.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 13 June 1, 1999.
