4 FOR the purpose of providing that a political action committee that makes a transfer

- 5 to the treasurer or political committee of a candidate or a slate of candidates
- 6 shall display its official name, as filed with the State Election Board, and a
- 7 reference that the entity is a political action committee, in a prominent place on
- 8 the face of the check by which the funds are transferred; defining a certain term;
- 9 and generally relating to the identification of a political action committee by
- 10 name on the face of the check by which the political action committee makes a
- 11 transfer.

- 28 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 29 MARYLAND, That Section(s) 1-101(y) through (pp), respectively, of Article 33 -

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1 Election Code of the Annotated Code of Maryland be renumbered to be Section(s) 2 1-101(z) through (qq), respectively.

SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Laws of Maryland 3 4 read as follows:

5 Article 33 - Election Code 6 1-101. (Y) (1) A POLITICAL PARTY; (2)A CENTRAL COMMITTEE; (3) A SLATE; A POLITICAL COMMITTEE ORGANIZED AND OPERATED SOLELY TO 12 (4) 13 SUPPORT OR OPPOSE A SINGLE CANDIDATE; OR A POLITICAL COMMITTEE ORGANIZED AND OPERATED SOLELY TO 14 (5)15 SUPPORT OR OPPOSE A BALLOT ISSUE.

17 In this subsection, "political committee" includes a political committee (a) 18 registered under § 13-202 of this subtitle and an out-of-state political committee.

19 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, during a 4-year 20 election cycle the treasurer of a political committee or the treasurer of a candidate 21 may not directly or indirectly transfer any money greater than \$6,000 to the treasurer 22 or political committee of a candidate or any other political committee.

23 The limitations on transfers and the provisions on affiliations set forth in (c) 24 this subsection may not apply to:

Transfers between and among political committees that are State or 25 (1)26 local committees of the same political party;

Transfers between and among a slate and its candidate members; 27 (2)28 and

29 Transfers between a campaign committee authorized by a candidate (3)30 and that candidate's treasurer.

31 (d) In applying the limitations of this subsection, all affiliated political

32 committees are treated as a single transferor. Political committees are "affiliated" if

33 they are organized and operated in coordination and cooperation with each other or

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otherwise conduct their operations and make their contribution decisions under the
 control of the same individual or entity.

3 (e) The limitations on transfers to the treasurer or political committee of a 4 candidate set forth in subsection (b) of this section shall apply to the individual 5 regardless of the number of offices for which that individual files a certificate of 6 candidacy within a 4-year election cycle.

7 (f) (1) No transfer of any kind, in any amount, is permitted if it is intended 8 to conceal the true identity of the actual contributor or the identity of the intended 9 recipient.

10 (2) A POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEE THAT MAKES A TRANSFER TO THE 11 TREASURER OR POLITICAL COMMITTEE OF A CANDIDATE OR A SLATE OF 12 CANDIDATES UNDER THIS SECTION SHALL:

13 (I) DISPLAY ITS OFFICIAL NAME, AS FILED WITH THE STATE
14 BOARD UNDER § 13-202 OF THIS SUBTITLE, IN A PROMINENT PLACE ON THE FACE OF
15 THE CHECK BY WHICH THE FUNDS ARE TRANSFERRED; AND

16 (II) INCLUDE IN A PROMINENT PLACE ON THE FACE OF THE CHECK
17 THE WORDS "POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEE" OR THE NOTATION "PAC" TO INDICATE
18 THAT THE ENTITY IS A POLITICAL ACTION COMMITTEE.

19 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 20 October 1, 1999.
