11 12	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

15	(a) In this section, "abandoned vessel" means any vessel that:
16 17	(1) Is left illegally or has remained without permission for more than 30 days on public property, including public marinas, docks, or boatyards;
	(2) Has remained on private property, including private marinas, docks, or boatyards, for more than [180] 30 days without the consent of the owner or person in control of the property; or
23	(3) Has been found adrift or unattended in or upon the waters of the State, and is found in a condition of disrepair as to constitute a hazard or obstruction to the use of the waters of the State or presents a potential health or environmental hazard.

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 October 1, 1999.
