1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Public Ethics Law - Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics - Records**

3 FOR the purpose of providing that certain statements filed by members of the  
4 General Assembly with the Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics may be  
5 examined by the public during regular business hours; requiring the Joint  
6 Committee to maintain a certain record when an individual examines a  
7 statement; requiring the Joint Committee to provide certain information to a  
8 member of the General Assembly on the member's request; and generally  
9 relating to the records of the Joint Committee on Legislative Ethics.

20 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
21 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

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**Article - State Government**

2 2-706.

3 (A) The Committee shall:

4 (1) perform all duties assigned to it by law or by legislative rules;

5 (2) from time to time, recommend to the presiding officers any changes  
6 in or amendments to the rules of legislative ethics;7 (3) on request of a member of the General Assembly, issue an advisory  
8 opinion regarding the legislative ethics of an action taken or contemplated to be taken  
9 by the member;

10 (4) on its own motion, issue advisory opinions as it deems necessary;

11 (5) at the request of the President or the Speaker, make  
12 recommendations concerning matters referred to the Committee;13 (6) as it deems necessary, issue guidelines and establish procedures for  
14 the implementation of the rules of legislative ethics; and

15 (7) maintain public records as the rules require.

16 (B) (1) THE COMMITTEE SHALL MAINTAIN THE STATEMENTS FILED BY  
17 MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY UNDER TITLE 15, SUBTITLE 5 OF THIS  
18 ARTICLE AND, DURING NORMAL OFFICE HOURS, MAKE THE STATEMENTS  
19 AVAILABLE TO THE PUBLIC FOR EXAMINATION AND COPYING.

20 (2) THE COMMITTEE SHALL MAINTAIN A RECORD OF:

21 (I) THE NAME AND HOME ADDRESS OF EACH INDIVIDUAL WHO  
22 EXAMINES OR COPIES A STATEMENT FILED WITH THE COMMITTEE BY A MEMBER OF  
23 THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY; AND24 (II) THE NAME OF THE MEMBER WHOSE STATEMENT WAS  
25 EXAMINED OR COPIED.26 (3) ON THE REQUEST OF THE MEMBER WHOSE STATEMENT WAS  
27 EXAMINED OR COPIED, THE COMMITTEE SHALL FORWARD TO THE MEMBER A COPY  
28 OF THE RECORD MAINTAINED BY THE COMMITTEE UNDER PARAGRAPH (2)(I) OF THIS  
29 SUBSECTION.

30 15-606.

31 (a) (1) The Ethics Commission shall maintain the statements submitted  
32 under this subtitle and, during normal office hours, make the statements available to  
33 the public for examination and copying.

1                   (2)       The Ethics Commission may charge a reasonable fee and adopt  
2 administrative procedures for the examination and copying of a statement.

3       (b)       (1)       The Ethics Commission shall maintain a record of:

4                   (i)       the name and home address of each individual who examines or  
5 copies a statement under this section; and

6                   (ii)       the name of the individual whose statement was examined or  
7 copied.

8                   (2)       On the request of the individual whose statement was examined or  
9 copied, the Ethics Commission shall forward a copy of that record to that individual.

10       SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take  
11 effect October 1, 1999.
