1 AN ACT concerning

3 FOR the purpose of adding Somerset County to provisions authorizing in specified jurisdictions the issuance of a Class A light wine license for retail sale of wine; authorizing certain wineries to provide wine samples to visitors in Somerset County; establishing certain restrictions and limitations on wine samples provided by a winery; and generally relating to the retail sale of wine in Somerset County. 9 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments, Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages Section 4-201 Annotated Code of Maryland (1998 Replacement Volume and 1998 Supplement) 14 BY adding to Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages Section 8-409.1 Annotated Code of Maryland (1998 Replacement Volume and 1998 Supplement) SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 20 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages 22 4-201. A Class A light wine license may be issued only in: (a) (1)Baltimore County; (2)Carroll County;

1 (2) A Class A light wine license may be issued to a holder of a Class 3 2 manufacturer's license, who makes wine from agricultural products grown in 3 Maryland.

4 (3) Baltimore County wineries applying for a Class A/Class 3 license are 5 exempt from quotas established by the Baltimore County Liquor Board as to the 6 number of licenses in that election district.

8 (A) IN SOMERSET COUNTY, THE HOLDER OF A CLASS 3 OR A CLASS 4 WINE 9 LICENSE MAY PROVIDE SAMPLES OF WINE TO PERSONS VISITING THE LICENSED 10 PREMISES.

(B) THE WINE SAMPLING PRIVILEGE AUTHORIZES THE HOLDER TO SERVE A
 MAXIMUM OF 2 OUNCES OF WINE FROM EACH GIVEN BRAND THAT IS
 MANUFACTURED ON THE PREMISES TO EACH PERSON FOR SAMPLING PURPOSES.

14 (C) THE WINE SAMPLE SHALL BE SERVED AND CONSUMED ON THE PREMISES 15 WHERE THE WINE IS MANUFACTURED.

16 (D) THE HOLDER MAY NOT CHARGE FOR THE SAMPLING.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 18 October 1, 1999.
