A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Morgan State University - Police Officers - Pensions and Retirement**

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain Morgan State University police officers to
4 become members of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System; providing
5 for certain exceptions; and generally relating to membership of Morgan State
6 University police officers in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article - State Personnel and Pensions**

21 26-201.

22 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, this subtitle applies
23 only to:

24 (1) an employee of the Department of Natural Resources commissioned
25 by the Secretary of Natural Resources as:

- 1 (i) a Natural Resources police officer; or
- 2 (ii) a law enforcement officer, other than a Natural Resources police
3 officer;
- 4 (2) a law enforcement officer employed by the Maryland Investigative
5 Services Unit;
- 6 (3) a member of the Maryland Transportation Authority Police Force
7 who has the powers granted to a police officer under § 4-208 of the Transportation
8 Article;
- 9 (4) a deputy sheriff employed by the Baltimore City Sheriff's
10 Department;
- 11 (5) a member of the University of Maryland Police Force who has the
12 powers granted to a police officer under § 13-601 of the Education Article;
- 13 (6) a law enforcement officer employed by a participating governmental
14 unit that on or after July 1, 1999 has elected to participate in the Law Enforcement
15 Officers' Pension System; [or]
- 16 (7) the State Fire Marshal or a Deputy State Fire Marshal; OR
- 17 (8) A MEMBER OF THE MORGAN STATE UNIVERSITY POLICE FORCE WHO
18 HAS THE POWERS GRANTED TO A POLICE OFFICER UNDER § 14-106 OF THE
19 EDUCATION ARTICLE.
- 20 (b) This subtitle does not apply to:
- 21 (1) a Maryland Transportation Authority police officer who transferred
22 from the Employees' Retirement System to the Employees' Pension System on or after
23 December 1, 1996;
- 24 (2) a deputy sheriff employed by the Baltimore City Sheriff's
25 Department who transferred from the Employees' Retirement System to the
26 Employees' Pension System on or after December 1, 1996;
- 27 (3) a member of the University of Maryland Police Force who transferred
28 from the Employees' Retirement System to the Employees' Pension System on or after
29 December 1, 1997;
- 30 (4) a law enforcement officer employed by a participating governmental
31 unit who transferred from the Employees' Retirement System to the Employees'
32 Pension System on or after December 1, 1997;
- 33 (5) a Maryland Port Administration police officer who transferred from
34 the Employees' Retirement System to the Employees' Pension System on or after
35 December 1, 1997; [or]

1 (6) a State Fire Marshal or Deputy State Fire Marshal who transferred
2 from the Employees' Retirement System to the Employees' Pension System on or after
3 December 1, 1996; OR

4 (7) A MEMBER OF THE MORGAN STATE UNIVERSITY POLICE FORCE WHO
5 TRANSFERRED FROM THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM TO THE EMPLOYEES'
6 PENSION SYSTEM ON OR AFTER DECEMBER 1, 1997.

7 26-202.

8 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, an individual described
9 in § 26-201 of this subtitle is a member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension
10 System as a condition of employment.

11 (b) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, membership in the Law
12 Enforcement Officers' Pension System is optional for an individual described in §
13 26-201 of this subtitle:

14 (i) who was employed by the Department of Natural Resources on
15 July 1, 1990 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 1997;

16 (ii) who was employed by the Maryland Investigative Services Unit
17 on June 30, 1995 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 1997;

18 (iii) who was employed by the Maryland Transportation Authority
19 on June 30, 1997 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 1997;

20 (iv) who was employed by the Baltimore City Sheriff's Department
21 on June 30, 1997 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 1997;

22 (v) who was employed by the University of Maryland Police Force
23 on June 30, 1999 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 1999;

24 (vi) who is employed by a participating governmental unit on the
25 effective date of participation on or after July 1, 1999 for that participating
26 government unit and who elects membership within 6 months of the effective date of
27 participation;

28 (vii) who was employed by the Maryland Port Administration Police
29 Force and was subsequently transferred to and employed by the Maryland
30 Transportation Authority Police Force on July 1, 1998 and who elects membership on
31 or before December 31, 1998; [or]

32 (viii) who was employed by the office of the State Fire Marshal on
33 June 30, 1998 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 1998; OR

34 (IX) WHO WAS EMPLOYED BY THE MORGAN STATE UNIVERSITY
35 POLICE FORCE ON JUNE 30, 1999 AND WHO ELECTS MEMBERSHIP ON OR BEFORE
36 DECEMBER 31, 1999.

1 (2) To elect to be a member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension
2 System, an individual shall file a written application with the State Retirement
3 Agency.

4 (3) If an individual does not elect membership during the applicable
5 period specified under paragraph (1) of this subsection, the individual may not
6 become a member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System.

7 26-203.1.

8 (a) For members who transfer from the Employees' Pension System or the
9 Employees' Retirement System, the Board of Trustees shall transfer to the
10 accumulation fund of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System the employer
11 contributions that were made to the Employees' Retirement System and the
12 Employees' Pension System on behalf of those members who transferred, plus the
13 interest earned on those contributions through the date of transfer.

14 (b) (1) For members who transfer from a local pension system, the local
15 pension system shall transfer to the Board of Trustees the employer contributions
16 that were made to the local pension system on behalf of those members who
17 transferred, plus the interest earned on those contributions through the date of
18 transfer.

19 (2) The Board of Trustees shall deposit any funds transferred under
20 paragraph (1) of this subsection in the accumulation fund of the Law Enforcement
21 Officers' Pension System.

22 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
23 July 1, 1999.
