6 (a) Subject to the hearing provisions of § 15-320 of this subtitle, the Board, on 7 the affirmative vote of a majority of its members then serving, may deny a license to 8 any applicant, reprimand any licensee, or suspend or revoke a license if:

9 (1) the applicant or licensee fraudulently or deceptively obtains,
10 RENEWS, or attempts to obtain OR RENEW a license OR PERMIT for the applicant or
11 licensee or for another;

12 (2) the applicant or licensee fraudulently or deceptively uses a license;

13 (3) under the laws of the United States or of any state, the applicant or 14 licensee is convicted of:

15 (i) a felony; or

16 (ii) a misdemeanor that is directly related to the fitness and 17 qualification of the applicant or licensee to practice land surveying or property line 18 surveying;

19 (4) the applicant or licensee is guilty of gross negligence, incompetence,20 or misconduct while practicing land surveying or property line surveying;
