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CHAPTER \_\_\_\_\_

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Mining - Land Reclamation Committee Members - Statement of**  
3 **Employment and Financial Interests**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring members of the Land Reclamation Committee to file  
5 certain statements concerning employment and financial interests; and  
6 generally relating to the Land Reclamation Committee.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,  
8 Article - Environment  
9 Section 15-204  
10 Annotated Code of Maryland  
11 (1996 Replacement Volume and 1998 Supplement)

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article - Environment**

15 15-204.

16 (a) (1) There is a Land Reclamation Committee. It consists of the following  
17 13 members:

18 (i) Two members of the Department, including a chairman of the  
19 Committee appointed by the Secretary;

1 (ii) A representative of the soil conservation district of Allegany  
2 County;

3 (iii) A representative of the soil conservation district of Garrett  
4 County;

5 (iv) Two members appointed by the Governor with the advice and  
6 consent of the Senate for 3-year terms to represent the mining industry;

7 (v) One member who is a representative of Allegany County to be  
8 appointed by the Governor, on the recommendation of the Allegany County  
9 Commissioners, with the advice and consent of the Senate to represent the local  
10 government for a 3-year term;

11 (vi) One member who is a representative of Garrett County to be  
12 appointed by the Governor, on the recommendation of the Garrett County  
13 Commissioners, with the advice and consent of the House of Delegates to represent  
14 local government for a 3-year term;

15 (vii) Two members from the community who do not have any  
16 interests in any mining operation, one to be a resident of Garrett County and one to  
17 be a resident of Allegany County, appointed by the Secretary for 3-year terms; and

18 (viii) Three members of the Department of Natural Resources  
19 appointed by the Secretary of Natural Resources.

20 (2) Committee members representing the community or local  
21 government shall receive the per diem set by the Secretary for each day they meet  
22 with the Committee or are called on by the chairman to transact other business of the  
23 Committee. Funds for the per diem allowances shall be provided for in the budget of  
24 the Department.

25 (3) The Committee shall meet at the chairman's request and at least  
26 twice a year. A quorum consists of at least 9 members. No action may be approved by  
27 the Committee unless a quorum is present and a majority of those present approves  
28 the action.

29 (4) MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE SHALL FILE A UNITED STATES  
30 DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR STATE EMPLOYEE STATEMENT OF EMPLOYMENT  
31 AND FINANCIAL INTERESTS.

32 [(4)] (5) Committee members shall recuse themselves from proceedings  
33 that may affect their direct or indirect financial interests.

34 (b) The Committee may:

35 (1) Study and recommend surface coal mine reclamation policies,  
36 practices, and standards;

1           (2)     From time to time, review the surface coal mining laws, regulations,  
2 and policies for the purpose of recommending changes to improve the efficiency and  
3 effectiveness of the program;

4           (3)     Review proposed changes to the surface coal mining laws and  
5 regulations to provide comments to the General Assembly and the Department;

6           (4)     Review the Department's administration of the surface coal mining  
7 regulatory program and the abandoned coal mine reclamation program to determine  
8 compliance with the purpose of the subtitles;

9           (5)     Enter on any surface coal mining operation to determine mining and  
10 reclamation conditions; and

11          (6)     Recommend research, demonstration, and cost-sharing projects to  
12 promote optimum revegetation of surface coal mined lands.

13     SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take  
14 effect July 1, 1999.
