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IN RESPONSE TO AN APPLICATION FOR AN INITIAL CRIMINAL 1 (2) (I) 2 HISTORY RECORDS CHECK, THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM CENTRAL 3 REPOSITORY SHALL PROVIDE TO THE COMMISSION AND THE APPLICANT; (I) A PRINTED STATEMENT OF THE APPLICANT'S STATE CRIMINAL 5 RECORD; AND. A REVISED PRINTED STATEMENT IF CRIMINAL HISTORY 6 (II)7 RECORD INFORMATION IS REPORTED TO THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION 8 SYSTEM CENTRAL REPOSITORY AFTER THE DATE OF THE INITIAL CRIMINAL 9 HISTORY RECORDS CHECK, THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE INFORMATION SYSTEM CENTRAL 10 REPOSITORY SHALL PROVIDE TO THE COMMISSION AND THE APPLICANT OR 11 LICENSEE A REVISED PRINTED STATEMENT OF THE APPLICANT'S OR LICENSEE'S 12 STATE CRIMINAL RECORD. - 21 [(c)] (D) The Commission may deny an applicant a license OR SUSPEND OR
- 22 REVOKE THE LICENSE OF A LICENSEE if the applicant OR LICENSEE has been
- 23 convicted of a crime that bears a direct relationship to the applicant's OR LICENSEE'S
- 24 fitness to serve the public as a for-hire driver.
- 25 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 26 effect October 1, 1999 is an emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate
- 27 preservation of the public health and safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote
- 28 supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the
- 29 General Assembly, and shall take effect from the date it is enacted.
