Family Law - Denial of or Interference with Visitation - Remedies
FOR the purpose of authorizing a court in a custody or visitation proceeding to order a party who has unjustifiably denied or interfered with visitation rights to pay certain expenses of the other party; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to remedies for the denial of or interference with visitation granted in a custody or visitation order. 3 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 4 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
5 Article - Family Law
6 9-105.
In any custody or visitation proceeding, if the court determines that a party to a custody or visitation order has unjustifiably denied or interfered with visitation granted by a custody or visitation order, the court may, in addition to any other remedy available to the court and in a manner consistent with the best interests of the child, take any or all of the following actions:

order that the visitation be rescheduled;

- 1 (2) modify the custody or visitation order to require additional terms or 2 conditions designed to ensure future compliance with the order; [or]
- 3 (3) assess costs or counsel fees against the party who has unjustifiably 4 denied or interfered with visitation rights; OR
- 5 (4) ORDER THE PARTY WHO HAS UNJUSTIFIABLY DENIED OR
- 6 INTERFERED WITH VISITATION RIGHTS TO PAY TO THE OTHER PARTY THE
- 7 REASONABLE EXPENSES, INCLUDING LOST WAGES AND TRAVEL EXPENSES,
- 8 INCURRED BY THE OTHER PARTY IN ATTENDING THE CUSTODY OR VISITATION
- 9 PROCEEDING.
- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply to
- 11 actions to enforce child custody or visitation orders filed on or after the effective date
- 12 of this Act.
- 13 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 14 effect October 1, 1999.
