

- 26 FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE MARYLAND HOPE SCHOLARSHIP TO THE
- 27 GOVERNOR AND THE LEGISLATIVE POLICY COMMITTEE OF THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY
- 28 BY OCTOBER 30, 1999. Maryland Higher Education Commission shall draft a plan to
- 29 administer the Maryland HOPE Scholarship Program established under Title 18,
- 30 Subtitle 22 of the Education Article. The Commission's plan shall include a 3-year
- 31 implementation schedule, beginning July 1, 2000, for the progressive availability of
- 32 the Maryland HOPE Scholarship Award to all eligible students. By October 30, 1999,
- 33 the Maryland Higher Education Commission shall submit the plan for the
- 34 implementation of the Maryland HOPE Scholarship Program to the Governor, and
- 35 subject to § 2 1246 of the State Government Article, the Senate Economic and
- 36 Environmental Affairs Committee and the House Ways and Means Committee.

- 1 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 2 of this Act shall 2 take effect October 1, 1999 <u>2000</u>.
- 3 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That subject to Section 4 of 4 this Act, Sections 1 and 3 of this Act shall take effect July 1, 1999.
