1 AN ACT concerning	
2 Public Schools - Integrated Pest Management	
3 FOR the purpose of extending the applicability of the integrated pest management 4 systems adopted by the county boards of education to certain areas at public 5 schools; providing for certain types of notice to be given before the application of 6 pesticides on school grounds under certain circumstances; requiring the 7 Department of Agriculture to develop certain standards and criteria by a certain 8 date; requiring county boards to develop and implement certain integrated pest 9 management systems for school grounds by a certain date; requiring the 10 Department, in consultation with the Maryland Association of Boards of 11 Education, to submit a certain report to the General Assembly by a certain date; 12 making stylistic changes; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally 13 relating to pesticide application in public schools.
