#### 18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

19 MARYLAND, That:

20 (1) The Board of Public Works may borrow money and incur indebtedness on

21 behalf of the State of Maryland through a State loan to be known as the Maryland

22 Consolidated Capital Bond Loan of 1999 in the total principal amount of \$426,291,000

23 <u>\$421,799,000</u>. This loan shall be evidenced by the issuance, sale, and delivery of State

24 general obligation bonds authorized by a resolution of the Board of Public Works and

25 issued, sold, and delivered in accordance with Sections 8-117 through 8-124 of the

26 State Finance and Procurement Article and Article 31, Section 22 of the Code.

27 (2) The bonds to evidence this loan or installments of this loan may be sold as
28 a single issue of bonds under Section 8-122 of the State Finance and Procurement
29 Article.

30 (3) The cash proceeds of the sale of the bonds shall be paid to the Treasurer 31 and first shall be applied to the payment of the expenses of issuing, selling, and 32 delivering the bonds, unless funds for this purpose are otherwise provided, and then 33 shall be credited on the books of the Comptroller and expended, on approval by the 34 Board of Public Works, for the following public purposes, including any applicable

39 SECTION 4. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, before work may 40 commence pursuant to any supplement to any appropriation contained herein,

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1 satisfactory assurance must be given to the Board of Public Works that the project can

2 be completed with the aggregate of the funds herein and heretofore appropriated for

3 the stated purpose.

4 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, with the approval of 5 the Department of Budget and Management, any appropriation for construction 6 provided in this Act may be used to purchase capital equipment if the amount of the 7 appropriation exceeds the amount required for construction expenses, including 8 allowances for contingencies.

SECTION 6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, except as otherwise
provided in this Act, before a State agency or institution named in this Act as
responsible for an individual item may begin work with funds appropriated by this
Act, the agency or institution shall provide satisfactory evidence to the Board of
Public Works that the work described in the individual item can be completed with
the funds specified for that item.

SECTION 7. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, with the approval of
the Department of Budget and Management, any appropriation under the provisions
of this Act that is in excess of the amount needed for a project may be credited to the
Construction Contingency Fund under Section 3-609 of the State Finance and
Procurement Article.

20 SECTION 8. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, if federal funds are 21 available to help accomplish any project identified in this Act, the State agency or

22 institution responsible for the project shall make efforts through proper

23 administrative procedures to obtain these federal funds. Before spending any funds

24 appropriated by this Act, the agency or institution shall certify its efforts to the Board

25 of Public Works and state the reason for any failure to obtain federal funds. If federal

26 funds are obtained, they shall be used to defray the costs of the project described in

27 this Act, and not to expand its scope.

SECTION 9. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, for any appropriation for planning of a State-owned project provided in this Act, if a program required by Section 3-602(d) of the State Finance and Procurement Article has not been submitted, then the State agency or institution responsible for the project shall submit a program to the Department of Budget and Management for approval before funds may be expended from the appropriation. For any appropriation for construction of a State-owned project provided in this Act, if preliminary plans and outline specifications required by Section 3-602(f)(2)(i) of the State Finance and Procurement Article have not been prepared, then the State agency or institution responsible for the project shall submit preliminary plans and outline specifications to the Department of Budget and Management for approval before funds may be sepended from the appropriation.

40 SECTION 10. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That, no portion of the 41 proceeds of a loan or any of the matching funds provided for a project funded under 42 this Act may be used for the furtherance of sectarian religious instruction, or in 43 connection with the design, acquisition, construction, or equipping of any building

1 used or to be used as a place of sectarian religious worship or instruction, or in

2 connection with any program or department of divinity for any religious

3 denomination. Upon the request of the Board of Public Works, a recipient of the

4 proceeds of a loan under this Act shall submit evidence satisfactory to the Board that

5 none of the proceeds of the loan or any matching funds has been or is being used for

6 a purpose prohibited by this Act.

7 SECTION 11. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That:

8 (a) the Comptroller may advance funds from any loan fund account to any
9 other loan fund account established pursuant to a General Obligation Loan Enabling
10 Act, under the authority of which general obligation bonds have been issued, for any
11 expenditure authorized by such Act.

(b) with the approval of the Board of Public Works, the Comptroller may
advance funds to any loan fund account established pursuant to a General Obligation
Loan Enabling Act, for which an approving legal opinion has been received by the
Board, for any expenditure authorized by the Act, provided that the next sale of
general obligation bonds shall include the issuance of bonds under the authority of
that Act in an amount at least equivalent to the amount of the funds so advanced.

18 SECTION 12. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the net new debt to be 19 authorized by legislation in fiscal year 2000 shall not exceed \$445,000,000, as 20 evidenced by the following:
