- 23 WHEREAS, The General Assembly of Maryland declares that it is necessary:
- 24 To enable economically disadvantaged youth, especially youth who have
- 25 not finished high school, to obtain the education, job skills training, personal
- 26 counseling, leadership development skills training, job placement assistance, and
- 27 long-term follow-up services necessary for them to achieve permanent economic
- 28 self-sufficiency;

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- 1 (2) To provide valuable community service that addresses urgent community
- 2 needs, including the demand for affordable housing and the need for young role
- 3 models and mentors for younger teenagers and children;
- 4 (3) To provide communities the opportunity to establish or rebuild
- 5 neighborhood stability in economically depressed and low-income areas, as well as
- 6 historic areas requiring restoration or preservation;
- 7 (4) To provide economically disadvantaged youth and youth who have not
- 8 finished high school an opportunity for meaningful participation in society;
- 9 (5) To allow communities to expand the supply of affordable housing for
- 10 homeless and other low-income individuals by utilizing the energies and talents of
- 11 economically disadvantaged youth who have not graduated from high school; and
- 12 (6) To foster the development of leadership skills and a commitment to
