A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Political Subdivisions - Residency Requirements for Chief Executive**
3 **Officers**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring a candidate for the office of the chief executive officer of
5 a political subdivision to be a resident of the political subdivision for a certain
6 period of time under certain circumstances; defining certain terms; providing for
7 the effective date of this Act; and generally relating to residency requirements
8 for chief executive officers of political subdivisions.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article 24 - Political Subdivisions - Miscellaneous Provisions**

18 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
19 INDICATED.

20 (2) "CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER" MEANS:

21 (I) THE MAYOR OF BALTIMORE CITY; OR

22 (II) THE COUNTY EXECUTIVE OF MONTGOMERY COUNTY.

23 (3) "POLITICAL SUBDIVISION" MEANS:

24 (I) BALTIMORE CITY; OR

25 (II) MONTGOMERY COUNTY.

1 (B) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (C) OF THIS SECTION, A CANDIDATE
2 FOR THE OFFICE OF THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER OF A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION
3 SHALL BE A RESIDENT OF THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION FOR AT LEAST 6 MONTHS
4 PRECEDING THE GENERAL ELECTION FOR THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER.

5 (C) IF THE CHARTER OF A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION CONTAINS A DURATIONAL
6 RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT THAT IS LONGER THAN 6 MONTHS, THE LONGER
7 DURATIONAL RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT SHALL BE RETAINED IF THE GOVERNING
8 BODY OF THE POLITICAL SUBDIVISION REAFFIRMS THE LONGER DURATIONAL
9 RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT BY ENACTMENT OF AN ORDINANCE EFFECTIVE NO
10 LATER THAN 4 WEEKS PRIOR TO THE FILING DEADLINE SPECIFIED IN ARTICLE 33, §
11 5-303(A) OF THE CODE.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 June 1, 1999.
