1 AN ACT concerning

2 Workers' Compensation - Permanent Total Disability Claims - Cost of Living 3 Adjustments

4 FOR the purpose of altering a provision of the workers' compensation law so as to

- 5 authorize an annual cost of living adjustment for certain claims regardless of
- 6 the date of the claim; clarifying certain language providing that certain covered
- 7 <u>employees are eligible for an award by the Criminal Injuries Compensation</u>

8 Board; requiring the Criminal Injuries Compensation Board to grant an award

9 <u>to a covered employee under certain circumstances;</u> and generally relating to

10 cost of living adjustments for permanent total disability claims under the

11 workers' compensation law.

12 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Labor and Employment

20 9-638.

21 (a) Compensation paid under this Part V of this subtitle is subject to an

22 annual cost of living adjustment, REGARDLESS OF THE DATE OF THE CLAIM.

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1 (b) On or before June 30 of each year, the Department of Labor, Licensing, and

2 Regulation shall determine and report to the Commission the rate of change in the

3 Consumer Price Index in the preceding calendar year, using as the Consumer Price

4 Index the lower of:

5 the average of the Consumer Price Indices (all urban consumers, all (1)6 item index) published by the United States Department of Labor for the Baltimore 7 MSA and the Washington, D.C. MSA; or

8 (2)the United States city average consumer price index (all urban 9 consumers, all item index).

On or before July 31 of each year, the Commission shall publish the 10 (c) (1)11 amount of the cost of living adjustment that shall become effective on January 1 of the 12 following year.

13 (2)The cost of living adjustment may not exceed 5%.

14 The compensation payable to a covered employee under this Part V of this (d) 15 subtitle shall be adjusted by:

multiplying the initial rate of compensation by the cost of living 16 (1)17 adjustment; and

18 (2)adding the product to the compensation, as adjusted, paid during the 19 prior year.

20 If a covered employee who is entitled to compensation under this Part (e) (1)

21 V of this subtitle also receives federal Social Security disability insurance benefits,

22 the adjusted annual compensation paid shall be reduced to the extent necessary to 23 avoid a diminution of the federal Social Security disability insurance benefits.

24 If federal Social Security law on disability insurance benefits no (2)

25 longer imposes a diminution in the payment of the adjustment in compensation,

26 payments of compensation shall be made to the full extent allowed under this section.

THIS SUBSECTION APPLIES ONLY TO A COVERED EMPLOYEE WHO: 27 (F) (1)

IS ENTITLED TO COMPENSATION UNDER THIS PART V OF THIS 28 <u>(I)</u> 29 SUBTITLE FOR WHICH THE COMPENSATION PAYABLE TO THE COVERED EMPLOYEE 30 IS NOT ADJUSTED BY THE ANNUAL COST OF LIVING ADJUSTMENT UNDER

31 SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION;

32 (II) WAS A VICTIM OF CRIME; AND

33 HAS NOT FILED A CLAIM FOR AN AWARD WITH THE CRIMINAL (III) 34 INJURIES COMPENSATION BOARD.

IN ADDITION TO COMPENSATION PAID BY ANY OTHER SOURCE 35 (2)36 WHICH THE COVERED EMPLOYEE RECEIVES FOR A PERMANENT TOTAL DISABILITY

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<u>CLAIM, THE COVERED EMPLOYEE IS ELIGIBLE FOR AN AWARD BY THE CRIMINAL</u>
 <u>INJURIES COMPENSATION BOARD FROM THE CRIMINAL INJURIES COMPENSATION</u>
 FUND.

4 (3) <u>NOTWITHSTANDING THE TIME OF FILING REQUIREMENTS UNDER</u>
5 ARTICLE 27, § 820 OF THE CODE, IF THE COVERED EMPLOYEE FILES A CLAIM FOR AN
6 AWARD WITH THE CRIMINAL INJURIES COMPENSATION BOARD, THE CRIMINAL
7 INJURIES COMPENSATION BOARD SHALL GRANT THE COVERED EMPLOYEE AN
8 AWARD.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That Section 5 of Chapter 591

10 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1987 may not be construed to prohibit a cost of

11 living adjustment for permanent total disability claims arising before January 1,

12 1988.

SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
 October July 1, 1999.
