CHAPTER

1 AN ACT concerning

- 2 Community Colleges - English for Speakers of Other Languages Programs -3 **Funding**
- FOR the purpose of removing increasing the limitation on the total funding for
- annual grants for the English for Speakers of Other Languages programs 5
- ("ESOL") at the community colleges in the State, including Baltimore City 6
- 7 Community College; requiring the Governor to include certain funds in the
- annual budget to reimburse community colleges, including Baltimore City 8
- Community College, for any deficiency in funds for grants for ESOL programs at 9
- the community colleges subject to a certain limitation; and generally relating to 10

- 17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 Article - Education
2 16-305.
3 (e) (1) (i) Beginning in Fiscal Year 1996, a grant in the amount provided 4 in paragraph (2) of this subsection shall be distributed to each board in order to 5 provide instruction and services to students enrolled in an English for Speakers of 6 Other Languages ("ESOL") program.
7 (ii) To qualify for a grant under this subsection, each participant in 8 the program shall be a student:
9 1. Born outside of the United States or whose native 10 language is not English;
Who comes from an environment where a language other than English is dominant; or
3. Who is an American Indian or Alaskan native and comes from an environment where a language other than English has had a significant impact on the student's level of English language proficiency.
16 (2) {(i) Subject to the provisions of subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph, 17 the ITHE amount of the grant shall be \$800 times the number of qualified full-time 18 equivalent students who are enrolled in a county ESOL program and at the 19 community college.

22 2. If, for any fiscal year, the total amount of the grants calculated under subparagraph (i) of this paragraph would exceed \$1,000,000 24 \$3,000,000, then each grant shall be prorated by the amount necessary to reduce the total amount of the grants to \$1,000,000 \$3,000,000.}
