A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Harford County - Liquor Control Board - Disclosure**

3 FOR the purpose of establishing that the members and employees of the Harford
4 County Liquor Control Board are subject to provisions of law regarding financial
5 disclosure, conflicts of interest, and lobbying activities; requiring members and
6 employees of the Liquor Control Board to provide certain disclosure; and
7 generally relating to the Harford County Liquor Control Board.

23 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
24 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

2 15-201.

3 (b)(1) Except in Harford County, the liquor control board shall consist of three
4 members in each county. Those persons who are members of the respective boards on
5 June 1, 1947, shall continue as such for the balance of the period for which they may
6 have been appointed or elected, according to the terms and conditions of their original
7 appointment or election. Provided that in Montgomery County, effective July 1, 1951,
8 there is hereby created the position of director of the Department of Liquor Control,
9 who shall be the chief administrative officer of said Department of Liquor Control.

10 (2) (I) In Harford County, the Liquor Control Board consists of 5
11 members.

12 (II) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THE CODE OR
13 LOCAL LAW, THE MEMBERS OF THE HARFORD COUNTY LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD ARE
14 SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS REGARDING FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE, CONFLICTS OF
15 INTEREST, AND LOBBYING ACTIVITIES UNDER TITLE 15, SUBTITLE 5, PART I, AND
16 SUBTITLES 6 AND 7 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE.

18 The liquor control board of each county shall have full power and authority
19 within its county:

20 (i) (4) NOTWITHSTANDING ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THE CODE OR LOCAL
21 LAW, EMPLOYEES OF THE HARFORD COUNTY LIQUOR CONTROL BOARD ARE SUBJECT
22 TO THE PROVISIONS REGARDING FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE, CONFLICTS OF INTEREST,
23 AND LOBBYING ACTIVITIES FOUND IN TITLE 15, SUBTITLE 5, PART I, AND SUBTITLES
24 6 AND 7 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE.

Article - State Government

26 15-601.

27 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, and subject to
28 subsections (c) and (d) of this section, each official and candidate for office as a State
29 official shall file a statement as specified in §§ 15-602 through 15-608 of this subtitle.

30 (b) Financial disclosure by a judge of a court under Article IV, § 1 of the
31 Constitution, a candidate for elective office as a judge, or a judicial appointee as
32 defined in Maryland Rule 16-814 is governed by § 15-610 of this subtitle.

33 (c) (1) An individual who is a public official only as a member of a board or
34 who is a member of the Board of Trustees of the Maryland Health Care Foundation
35 established under § 2-501 of the Health - General Article and who receives annual
36 compensation that is less than 25% of the lowest annual compensation at State grade
37 level 16 shall file the statement required by subsection (a) of this section in
38 accordance with § 15-609 of this subtitle.

1 (2) A MEMBER OR EMPLOYEE OF THE HARFORD COUNTY LIQUOR
2 CONTROL BOARD SHALL FILE THE STATEMENT REQUIRED BY SUBSECTION (A) OF
3 THIS SECTION IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 15-609 OF THIS SUBTITLE.

4 (d) A commissioner or an applicant for appointment as commissioner of a
5 bicounty commission shall file the statement required by subsection (a) of this section
6 in accordance with Subtitle 8, Part III of this title.

7 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
8 October 1, 1999.
