13 14	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
15	Article - Labor and Employment

17	(a) The Commission retains jurisdiction pending an appeal to consider:
18	(1) a request for additional medical treatment and attention; AND
19	(2) A REQUEST FOR TEMPORARY TOTAL BENEFITS.
	(b) (1) If the Commission finds that a covered employee needs additional medical attention pending an appeal, the Commission may pass a supplemental order requiring the employer to provide additional medical treatment and attention.
25	(2) IF THE COMMISSION FINDS THAT A COVERED EMPLOYEE NEEDS TEMPORARY TOTAL BENEFITS PENDING AN APPEAL, THE COMMISSION MAY PASS A SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER REQUIRING THE EMPLOYER TO AWARD THE EMPLOYEE TEMPORARY TOTAL BENEFITS.

- 1 A supplemental order passed by the Commission under this section is (c) 2 subject to review on the pending appeal.
- 3 (d) When an appeal that is pending relates solely to a penalty imposed by the 4 Commission, the Commission retains jurisdiction over all matters in the case other
- 5 than imposition of the penalty.
