3 FOR the purpose of defining the term "registration card" for certain provisions of law
4 concerning carrying and displaying a registration card, to include a valid vehicle
5 rental agreement under certain circumstances; and generally relating to
6 registration cards for rental vehicles.

17 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
18 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - Transportation

2 13-409.

3 (a) IN THIS SECTION, "REGISTRATION CARD" INCLUDES A VALID RENTAL
4 AGREEMENT IN THE CASE OF A RENTAL VEHICLE THAT:

5 (1) IS RENTED UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF TITLE 18 OF THIS ARTICLE;
6 OR

7 (2) IS REGISTERED IN ANOTHER STATE.

8 (B) An individual who is driving or in control of a vehicle shall carry a
9 registration card in the vehicle to which the registration card refers.

10 [(b)] (C) On demand of a police officer who identifies himself as a police
11 officer, an individual who is driving or in control of a vehicle shall display a
12 registration card that refers to the vehicle.

13 [(c)] (D) This section does not apply if the card is being used to apply for the
14 transfer of registration of the vehicle.

16 In this title, "rent" means to rent or lease for a period not exceeding 180 days.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
18 October 1, 1999.
