5 (d) (1) Any local health department may set and collect a fee for processing 6 and issuing a death certificate that covers the administrative costs of providing this 7 service.

(e) The Secretary shall include with every copy of a death certificate, in a form
prescribed and provided by the Insurance Commissioner, a notice which advises that
certain individuals may be entitled to continuation of group health insurance benefits
under § 15-407 of the Insurance Article.

(f) The Secretary shall include with every copy of a death certificate, in a form
prescribed by the Insurance Commissioner, a notice which advises that certain
individuals may be entitled to become members of the Maryland Group Health
Insurance Plan under Title 14, Subtitle 3 of the Insurance Article.

19 (g) A person may use a photocopy of a birth, death, fetal death, or marriage 20 certificate for any nonfraudulent and nondeceptive purpose.
