14 15	WHEREAS, The State of Maryland has been investigating and studying the concept of an 800 megahertz communications system since the early 1980s; and
	WHEREAS, Consultants have been hired in the past to research this issue and all have recommended that the State implement a statewide 800 megahertz wireless communications system; and
	WHEREAS, This system would provide State and local government agencies with access to an efficient and reliable multipurpose statewide wireless voice, data, fax, and imaging communications system; and

- 1 WHEREAS, A statewide system would provide capacity for all State
- 2 departments and agencies and could be shared with local and federal governments;
- 3 and
- 4 WHEREAS, Most jurisdictions have daily emergencies that need response from
- 5 neighboring counties; and
- 6 WHEREAS, A statewide communications system would facilitate
- 7 communications between emergency operations centers and result in a much safer
- 8 atmosphere for firefighters, police officers, and citizens of the State; and
- 9 WHEREAS, There could be cost sharing with State, local, and federal

- WHEREAS, The Department of Budget and Management prepared a favorable

- 34 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 35 July 1, 1999. It shall remain effective for a period of 1 year and, at the end of June 30,

- 1 2000, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be 2 abrogated and of no further force and effect.
