

- 27 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 28 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

1 **Article - Health Occupations** 2 17-202. 3 (a) (1) The Board consists of nine members appointed by the Governor with 4 the advice of the Secretary. 5 (2) Of the nine Board members: Five shall be [certified] LICENSED as professional counselors[, 6 7 licensed] under Subtitle 3A of this section, including: 1. One who is primarily engaged in professional counselor 9 education; 10 2. One who is employed in the private sector; 11 3. One who is employed in the public sector; and 12 4. Two professional counselors at large; 13 One shall be a licensed [professional counselor-marriage and (ii) 14 family] CLINICAL MARRIAGE AND FAMILY therapist; 15 One shall be a certified [or licensed] professional (iii) 16 counselor-alcohol and drug OR LICENSED CLINICAL ALCOHOL AND DRUG COUNSELOR; and 18 (iv) Two shall be consumer members. 19 The composition of the Board as to the race and sex of its members 20 shall reflect the composition of the population of the State. 21 (4) The Governor shall appoint the professional counselors from a list submitted to the Governor by the Secretary. Any association representing professional counselors may submit recommendations for Board members to the Secretary. The consumer members of the Board: 24 (b) 25 (1) Shall be members of the general public; May not be or ever have been a certified OR LICENSED professional 26 (2) 27 counselor or in training to become a certified OR LICENSED professional counselor; (3) May not have a household member who is a certified OR LICENSED 28 29 professional counselor or in training to become a certified OR LICENSED professional 30 counselor; May not participate or ever have participated in a commercial or 31

- 35 (2) REDUCE THE PERIOD OF A SUSPENSION OR PROBATION; OR
- 36 (3) WITHDRAW A REPRIMAND.
