	WHEREAS, Eighty percent of school children across the nation need nonparental supervision because their parents work and at least one-third of these students are left unsupervised; and
	WHEREAS, Almost half of juvenile crime takes place between 2 p.m. and 8 p.m. each day and the after-school hours also are the most frequent time when students are victims of crime and accidents; and


