A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Baltimore City - Alcoholic Beverages Appeals - Remand**

3 FOR the purpose of adding Baltimore City to the list of jurisdictions in which a circuit
4 court may remand certain licensing proceedings to the local licensing board; and
5 generally relating to alcoholic beverages licensing proceedings in Baltimore City.

16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

18 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

19 16-101.

20 (a) The decision of a local licensing board, in approving, suspending, revoking
21 and restricting, or refusing to approve, suspend, revoke or restrict any license, or
22 licensee, shall be subject to appeal in the manner provided in this section.

23 (e) (4) (i) If the court reverses the action of the local licensing board it
24 shall file with the papers a written statement of the reasons. The court may modify,
25 as well as affirm or reverse, the action of the local licensing board. Costs shall be
26 awarded as in other civil cases.

1 (ii) In addition to the other powers of the court provided in this
2 article, the court may remand the proceedings to the local licensing board in the
3 following [counties] JURISDICTIONS:

- 4 1. BALTIMORE CITY;
- 5 2. Carroll County;
- 6 [2.] 3. Charles County;
- 7 [3.] 4. Frederick County;
- 8 [4.] 5. Howard County;
- 9 [5.] 6. Montgomery County;
- 10 [6.] 7. Prince George's County; and
- 11 [7.] 8. St. Mary's County.

12 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
13 October 1, 1999.
