CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Treasurer - Staff - Special Appointments**

3 FOR the purpose of providing for the designation of certain staff members employed
4 by the Treasurer as special appointments; providing for the compensation of
5 certain staff; providing reimbursement of certain expenses for certain staff; and
6 generally relating to staff employed by the Treasurer.

7 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

14 **Article - State Government**

15 5-105.

16 (a) (1) The Treasurer may employ a staff in accordance with the State
17 budget.

18 (2) While on the staff, an individual shall be covered by a surety bond in
19 the form and amount required by law.

1 (3) STAFF MEMBERS APPOINTED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION:

2 (I) ARE DEEMED SPECIAL APPOINTMENTS WITHIN THE MEANING
3 OF § 6-405 OF THE STATE PERSONNEL AND PENSIONS ARTICLE; AND

4 (II) SERVE AT THE PLEASURE OF THE TREASURER.

5 (4) STAFF APPOINTED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION ARE ENTITLED TO
6 COMPENSATION AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

7 (5) STAFF ARE ENTITLED TO REIMBURSEMENT OF EXPENSES UNDER
8 THE STANDARD STATE TRAVEL REGULATIONS, AS PROVIDED IN THE STATE BUDGET.

9 [(3)] (6) The staff shall perform the duties that the Treasurer assigns.

10 (b) (1) From among the employees on the staff, the Treasurer may designate
11 1 Chief Deputy Treasurer and 1 or more deputy treasurers.

12 (2) A designation as Chief Deputy Treasurer or as deputy treasurer may
13 be terminated:

14 (i) by the Treasurer for any reason that the Treasurer considers
15 sufficient; or

16 (ii) if the Treasurer is ill or absent, by the other members of the
17 Board of Public Works for any reason that the members consider sufficient.

18 (3) A termination of the designation as Chief Deputy Treasurer or as
19 deputy treasurer is not, of itself, a termination of employment.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
21 October 1, 1999.
