## Ethics Law - Study Commission on Lobbyist Ethics

3 FOR the purpose of creating a Study Commission on Lobbyist Ethics; providing for
4 the appointment of the Commission; specifying the duties of the Commission; 5 requiring the Commission to issue a certain report by a certain date; providing 6 for the termination of the Commission; and generally relating to the Study 7 Commission on Lobbyist Ethics.

8 WHEREAS, The Maryland Public Ethics Law was enacted in 1979 to assure the 9 people of this State that the operations of government are free from improper 10 influence and the appearance of improper influence; and

11 WHEREAS, The Ethics Law regulates not only officials and public employees, 12 but also persons who lobby on behalf of private sector interests; and

13 WHEREAS, While officials and employees are subject to an extensive code of 14 ethical conduct under the Ethics Law, regulated lobbyists are generally subject only to
15 financial reporting requirements; and

1 WHEREAS, Since the enactment of the Ethics Law 20 years ago, the business of 2 lobbying has grown enormously, with a substantial increase in the number of 3 regulated lobbyists, their compensation, and their impact on the legislative process 4 and the functioning of the Executive Branch; and Governor. including:

WHEREAS, In 1998, the General Assembly created a special study commission to revise the law relating to legislative ethics, but did not authorize that commission to review the provisions of the Ethics Law relating to regulated lobbyists; and

WHEREAS, The people of Maryland have a right to be assured that the practice of lobbying is carried out in a way that enhances the public welfare and does not subject our government to improper influence or create the appearance of improper influence; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That:
(a) There is a Study Commission on Lobbyist Ethics.
(b) The Commission shall consist of the following $4 \underline{13}$ members:
(1) Three individuals, at least one of whom shall be a member of the Senate of Maryland and one of whom shall be a regulated lobbyist, appointed by the President of the Senate;

> (2) Three individuals, at least one of whom shall be a member of the House of Delegates and one of whom shall be a regulated lobbyist, appointed by the Speaker of the House; and
(3) Five individuals, at least one of whem shall represent the State

Ethies Commission and one of whom shall be a regulated lobbyist, appointed by the
(1) Four individuals appointed by the President of the Senate,
(i) At least two members of the Senate of Maryland;
(ii) At least one regulated lobbyist; and
(iii) If necessary to fill the four appointments allowed to the President under this paragraph, one additional individual;
(2) Four individuals appointed by the Speaker of the House,
(i) At least two members of the House of Delegates;
(ii) At least one regulated lobbyist; and
(iii) If necessary to fill the four appointments allowed to the Speaker under this paragraph, one additional individual; and

## (i) At least one member of the State Ethics Commission;

## (ii) At least one regulated lobbyist; and

(iii) If necessary to fill the five appointments allowed to the

5 Governor under this paragraph, one or two additional individuals.
6 (c) The chairman of the Commission shall be designated jointly by the 7 President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House.

8 (d) The Department of Legislative Services and the State Ethics
9 Commission shall provide staff for the Commission.
10 (e) The Commission shall:

(1) Examine the Maryland Public Ethics Law as it relates to

12 regulated lobbyists;

14 ethics for regulated lobbyists, including provisions of law relating to the regulation of 15 lobbyists enacted by other jurisdictions;

20 (6) Report its findings to the Governor and, subject to § 2-1246 of 21 the State Government Article, to the General Assembly not later than December 31,
