Economic Matters

Health Insurance - Reimbursements to Health Care Practitioners - Costs of Oncology Drugs

This bill repeals current law that prohibits insurers, nonprofit health service plans, and HMOs (carriers) from reimbursing health care practitioners in an amount less than the health care practitioner's cost for oncology drugs.

This bill is effective June 1, 1999.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill would not directly affect governmental finances.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: Minimal. Costs to health care practitioners may increase if carriers reduce their reimbursements for oncology drugs.
