House Bill 690 (Delegate Edwards)

Environmental Matters

Hunting Accidents - Duty to Render Assistance - Reporting of Accidents

This bill provides that a person who carelessly or negligently shoots, wounds, or kills another person, or who, while engaged in hunting wildlife, witnesses an injury inflicted on another person by a weapon is required to (1) render all reasonable assistance to the person injured; and (2) arrange for the transportation of the person to a physician, surgeon, or hospital for medical treatment if the injured person requests medical treatment, or it is apparent that medical treatment is necessary. All persons involved in a “hunting accident” are required to exchange in writing their names, addresses, and hunting license numbers.

Any physician, hospital, or medical facility that treats a person for a hunting accident, or law enforcement agent who investigates a hunting accident, is required to notify the Natural Resources Police as soon as practical. To the extent the information is available, the report should include the person’s name and address, a description of the injury, and the type of hunting accident.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill would not materially alter State operations or finances. Any additional administrative cost associated with the bill could be handled with the Department of Natural Resources’ existing resources.

Background: The Natural Resources Police investigate approximately 30 hunting-related firearms and tree stand accidents each year.
