House Bill 782 (Delegate Minnick) Appropriations

Firefighters and Emergency Medical Personnel - Collective Bargaining Requirements

This bill requires firefighter and emergency medical personnel employers and employees who participate in collective bargaining to discuss and resolve the following issues:

- whether an employer may suspend without pay an employee charged with alleged misdemeanor conduct that is pending adjudication; and
- while misdemeanor charges are pending against an employee, the rights of an employer to:
 - return the employee to full duty;
 - return the employee to an administrative, reduced duty, or light duty assignment; or
 - suspend the employee with pay.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. This bill does not apply to State firefighter or emergency medical personnel.

Local Effect: Minimal increase in personnel expenditures for local jurisdictions with collective bargaining for their firefighters and emergency medical personnel, if collective bargaining results in additional compensation to employees who are subject to pending misdemeanor charges. **This bill imposes a mandate on units of local government.**

Small Business Effect: None.
