Senate Bill 413 (Senator Middleton)

Economic and Environmental Affairs

Education - Charles County Board of Education - Elimination of Staggered Terms

This bill eliminates the staggered terms of office for members of the Charles County Board of Education by requiring all board members to be elected at the gubernatorial election.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: None. Eliminating the staggering of board members elections would not affect Charles County finances.

Small Business Effect: None.

Fiscal Analysis

Background: The Charles County Board of Education has 7 members elected to a 4-year term. Three members will be elected in calendar 2000 and 4 in calendar 2002. Pursuant to this legislation, the staggering of board members elections would be eliminated and all 7 members would be elected at the gubernatorial election beginning in calendar 2002. Accordingly, the 3 board members elected in 2000 will only serve for 2 years.
