House Bill 225 (Delegate Morhaim)

Environmental Matters

Health Occupations - Practice of Medicine - Licensure Requirements

This bill requires the Board of Physician Quality Assurance to waive the examination requirements for an applicant to practice medicine who holds a certificate of proficiency and professional standing from another state that was issued before January 1, 1985. Current law does not specify a date before which a certificate must be issued.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Special fund revenues from examination fees could increase by a negligible amount. The Board of Physician Quality Assurance receives very few applications based on another state's exam. Expenditures would not be affected.

Local Effect: None.
