House Bill 585 (Montgomerv Countv and Prince George's Countv Delegations) Appropriations

Prince George's County and Montgomery County - Highways - Prohibitions MC/PG 1-99

This bill prohibits the Maryland Department of Transportation (MDOT) from acquiring additional rights-of-way or spending any funds for the design or construction, in Prince George's or Montgomery counties, of the proposed: (1) intercounty connector; (2) the Washington bypass; or (3) highway designated as highway A-58.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Transportation Trust Fund expenditures could decrease by \$14,408,000 in FY 2000. Expenditures in the out-years would not be affected.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Fiscal Analysis

State Expenditures: According to the Maryland Consolidated Transportation Program (CTP) for fiscal 1999 through 2004, MDOT plans to spend \$14,408,000 in fiscal 2000 to purchase rights-of-way for the proposed intercounty connector highway project. There are no funds programmed for the project beyond fiscal 2000. Through fiscal 1999, a total of \$51,925,000 in special funds and \$10,925,000 in federal funds have been expended for planning, engineering, and right-of-way acquisition. No funds are included in the CTP for the Washington bypass or the proposed highway designated as A-58.
