### **Real Estate Brokers - Continuing Education**

This bill clarifies that real estate licensees who have been licensed for at least ten years may renew their licenses if they complete six clock hours of continuing education instruction on relevant changes in federal, State, and local real estate law.

The bill requires this continuing education instruction to include at least one 1.5 clock hour course every two years that outlines federal, State, and local fair housing laws and regulations, including fair housing advertising. However, this requirement does not apply to a licensee who provides real estate brokerage services solely in connection with nonresidential real estate.
