Judiciary

Family Law - Covenant Marriage

This bill authorizes a man and a woman to enter into a covenant marriage, in which the parties agree to:

- participate in premarital counseling;
- make all reasonable efforts to preserve the marriage before seeking a divorce, including marital counseling; and
- waive the right to a no-fault divorce.

Parties wishing to enter into a covenant marriage must declare their intent to do so on the marriage license application and submit a declaration of intent containing specified elements.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill is not expected to have a material effect on governmental finances.

Additional Comments: To the extent that the bill results in fewer divorces in future years, court workloads and operating expenses could be reduced. Any such reduction cannot be determined at this time.
