# Carroll County - Forest Conservation Program - Agricultural Preservation Land - Exceptions

This bill exempts any activity conducted on land in Carroll County that has been placed into an agricultural land preservation easement administered by the Maryland Agricultural Land Preservation Foundation from requirements of the Forest Conservation Act relating to sediment and erosion control plans.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None.

Local Effect: Minimal impact on Carroll County. The bill would only affect a small number

of properties.

**Small Business Effect:** Minimal.

### **Fiscal Analysis**

**Background:** The Forest Conservation Act provides that before an application for sediment and erosion control or subdivision is approved, a local jurisdiction must approve a forest conservation plan for the site. The plan, and its accompanying forest stand delineation, identifies and protects forests located in sensitive areas, including stream buffers, steep slopes, and flood plains. The amount of forest retained on the site is set at levels deemed consistent with projected land use. If this is not possible, options for mitigation exist through off-site planting or payments into a local reforestation fund. The Act also allows local jurisdictions to develop programs that address specific land use issues.
