FISCAL NOTE

House Bill 407 (Montgomery County Delegation)

Economic Matters

Montgomery County - Alcoholic Beverages - Drive-Through Facilities
MC 911-99

This bill prohibits an alcoholic beverage licensee in Montgomery County from selling alcoholic beverages through a drive-through window. This provision does not apply to existing licensees that have drive-through facilities prior to February 1, 1999, or the transfer of an existing license that has a drive-through facility. Current law prohibits drive-through alcoholic beverage sales only in Carroll County.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. Alcoholic beverage licenses are issued and monitored by local licensing authorities.

Local Effect: None. The Montgomery County Board of License Commissioners could monitor alcoholic beverage licensees with existing resources. Because license fees for establishments with drive-through windows are the same as for establishments without these facilities, license fee revenues would not be affected.

Small Business Effect: None.
