# FISCAL NOTE Revised

Senate Bill 7 (Senator Lawlah) Budget and Taxation

#### Sales and Use Tax Exemption - Certain Wholesome Foods

This bill exempts from the sales and use tax vending machine sales of milk, fresh fruit and vegetables, and yogurt.

This bill is effective July 1, 1999.

## **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** General fund revenues could decline by an estimated \$140,400 in FY 2000, increasing by 3% annually. Expenditures would not be affected.

Local Effect: None.

**Small Business Effect:** Minimal, except for those small businesses engaged solely in vending machine sales of wholesome foods.

### **Fiscal Analysis**

**State Revenues:** The Maryland/D.C. Vending Association reports that taxable vending machine sales will total \$153.7 million in 1998, and that approximately 1.83% of sales are of items that would be exempt under this bill. The taxable value of the \$2.8 million of sales of these foods will be \$2.7 million due to the backout for vending machine sales. Assuming

growth of 3% annually, general fund revenues will decline by an estimated \$140,415 in fiscal 2000.

**Small Business Effect:** Small businesses whose business is comprised solely of vending machine sales of certain wholesome foods could realize a substantial increase in profit margins under this bill if they do not pass on the savings to consumers. If margins in the vending machine business are currently 10%, profits would increase by nearly 50%. The number of such small businesses, if any, and the portion of the wholesome food vending sales which they represent is not known.
