FISCAL NOTE

Senate Bill 227 (Senator Frosh) Economic and Environmental Affairs

Agriculture - Organically Produced Commodities

This bill provides that the Maryland Department of Agriculture (MDA) may not require a certified organic farmer to use a practice or pesticide on land that grows organically produced commodities if the practice or pesticide is prohibited by (1) the Federal Organic Foods Production Act of 1990; or (2) regulations promulgated by the department.

The bill also provides that persons who are certified as organic farmers may not use a practice or pesticide prohibited by the Federal Organic Foods Production Act of 1990 on land that grows organically produced commodities. Violators of this provision are subject to a civil penalty of up to \$1,000.

This bill takes effect June 1, 1999.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: Potential minimal general fund revenue increase due to the bill's civil penalty provision. No effect on expenditures.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: Minimal.

Fiscal Analysis

State Effect: The Maryland Department of Agriculture advises that there are between 50 and 60 registered organic farmers. To the extent that these farmers are fined for violations of the provisions of the bill general fund revenues would increase. At this time, the extent of any revenue increase cannot be reliably estimated, however, it is assumed to be minimal.
