**Environmental Matters** 

#### **Consent to Mental Health Treatment - Minors**

This departmental bill provides that the capacity of a minor who is 16 years old or older to consent to mental health treatment does not include the capacity to refuse treatment to which a parent or guardian consents. The bill takes effect July 1, 1999.

### **Fiscal Summary**

**State Effect:** None. The bill would not substantively change State activities or operations.

Local Effect: None.

**Small Business Effect:** The Department of Health and Mental Hygiene has determined that this bill has minimal or no impact on small business (attached). Legislative Services concurs with this assessment.

## **Fiscal Analysis**

**State Expenditures:** None. State mental health facilities will be able to continue to provide treatment for minors whose parent or guardian has consented to mental health treatment for the minor.

**Local Expenditures:** None. Local governments that operate mental health clinics will be able to continue to provide treatment for minors whose parent or guardian has consented to mental health treatment for the minor.
