# AMENDMENT NO. 1

On page 1, in line 4, after "Standard" insert "for certain facilities"; in line 9, after "date;" insert "requiring the Maryland Occupational Safety and Health Advisory Board to develop certain methods for monitoring certain injuries, adopt certain regulations, track certain injuries, and submit a certain report to the General Assembly on or before a certain date;"; in line 22, strike "SECTION" and substitute "SUBTITLE"; in lines 24 and 27, in each instance, strike "PATHOGENS" and substitute "PATHOGEN"; in line 24, after "MEANS" insert "A"; in line 25, strike "MICROORGANISMS" and substitute "MICROORGANISMS"; and in the same line, strike "ARE" and substitute "IS".

### AMENDMENT NO. 2

On page 2, in line 26, after "SERVICES" insert "<u>IN THE COURSE OF THE PERSON'S</u>"; in the same line, strike "THE" and substitute "<u>A</u>"; and in line 27, after "(F)" insert "<u>"HEALTH CARE FACILITY" MEANS A HEALTH CARE FACILITY AS DEFINED IN § 19-101(F) OF THE HEALTH - GENERAL ARTICLE.</u>

On page 3, in line 15, after "MATERIALS" insert "IN HEALTH CARE FACILITIES"; in lines 18 and 21, in each instance, strike "2000" and substitute "2001"; after line 21, insert:

"(C) THE BLOODBORNE PATHOGEN STANDARD ADOPTED PURSUANT TO THIS  $\underline{\text{SUBTITLE:}}$ 

### (1) SHALL APPLY ONLY TO HEALTH CARE FACILITIES; AND

- (2) MAY NOT BE APPLIED TO INTERORAL PROCEDURES PERFORMED BY LICENSED DENTISTS.
- (D) THE MARYLAND OCCUPATIONAL SAFETY AND HEALTH ADVISORY BOARD SHALL:
- (1) DEVELOP METHODS FOR MONITORING SHARPS INJURIES IN HEALTH CARE SETTINGS OUTSIDE OF HEALTH CARE FACILITIES;
- (2) ADOPT REGULATIONS THAT REQUIRE ALL HEALTH CARE WORKERS TO REPORT ALL SHARPS INJURIES:
- (3) TRACK AND MONITOR SHARPS INJURIES THAT OCCUR OUTSIDE OF HEALTH CARE FACILITIES; AND
- (4) REPORT TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IN ACCORDANCE WITH § 2-1246 OF THE STATE GOVERNMENT ARTICLE, ON OR BEFORE JUNE 1, 2001 ON THE NEED TO EXTEND THE BLOODBORNE PATHOGEN STANDARD TO ALL HEALTH CARE WORKERS.";

and in line 23, after "STANDARD" insert "FOR HEALTH CARE FACILITIES".
