3 **Loss Resulting from Chemotherapy or Radiation Treatment for Cancer**

4 FOR the purpose of requiring certain insurers, nonprofit health service plans, and
5 health maintenance organizations to provide coverage for ~~chemotherapy a hair~~
6 ~~protheses prosthesis~~ prosthesis under certain circumstances; limiting the cost of a certain
7 hair prosthesis; requiring that a certain hair prosthesis must be prescribed;
8 providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to coverage for
9 ~~chemotherapy a hair protheses prosthesis~~ prosthesis for hair loss resulting from
10 chemotherapy or radiation treatment for cancer.

6 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 7 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

8 **Article - Insurance**

9 15-835.

10 (A) THIS SECTION APPLIES TO:

11 (1) INSURERS AND NONPROFIT HEALTH SERVICE PLANS THAT PROVIDE
 12 INPATIENT HOSPITAL, MEDICAL, OR SURGICAL BENEFITS TO INDIVIDUALS OR
 13 GROUPS ON AN EXPENSE-INCURRED BASIS UNDER HEALTH INSURANCE POLICIES
 14 OR CONTRACTS THAT ARE ISSUED OR DELIVERED IN THE STATE; AND

15 (2) HEALTH MAINTENANCE ORGANIZATIONS THAT PROVIDE INPATIENT
 16 HOSPITAL, MEDICAL, OR SURGICAL BENEFITS TO INDIVIDUALS OR GROUPS UNDER
 17 CONTRACTS THAT ARE ISSUED OR DELIVERED IN THE STATE.

18 (B) (1) SUBJECT TO PARAGRAPH (2) OF THIS SUBSECTION, AN ENTITY
 19 SUBJECT TO THIS SECTION SHALL PROVIDE COVERAGE FOR A CHEMOTHERAPY HAIR
 20 PROSTHESIS FOR AN INDIVIDUAL WHOSE HAIR LOSS RESULTS FROM
 21 CHEMOTHERAPY, FOR AN ENROLLEE OR INSURED WHOSE HAIR LOSS RESULTS
 22 FROM CHEMOTHERAPY OR RADIATION TREATMENT FOR CANCER, COVERAGE FOR
 23 ONE HAIR PROSTHESIS.

24 (2) THE COST OF A HAIR PROSTHESIS REQUIRED UNDER PARAGRAPH (1)
 25 OF THIS SUBSECTION MAY NOT EXCEED ~~\$250~~ \$350.

26 (2) (C) TO BE COVERED UNDER THIS SECTION, ~~THE CHEMOTHERAPY A~~
 27 HAIR PROSTHESIS MUST BE PRESCRIBED BY THE ONCOLOGIST IN ATTENDANCE.

28 (C) ~~A POLICY OR CONTRACT SUBJECT TO THIS SECTION MAY NOT IMPOSE A~~
 29 ~~DEDUCTIBLE ON THE COVERAGE REQUIRED UNDER THIS SECTION.~~

32 (i) The provisions of §§ 12-203(g), 15-105, 15-112, 15-113, 15-804, 15-812,
 33 15-826, [and] 15-828, AND 15-835 of the Insurance Article shall apply to health
 34 maintenance organizations.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall apply to all
2 policies or contracts issued, delivered, or renewed in the State on or after October 1,
3 2000.

4 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
5 October 1, 2000.
