FOR the purpose of establishing a certain minimum compensation for members of an honor guard organized by the Adjutant General to attend the burial service of a deceased veteran; and generally relating to compensation for members of an honor guard organized by the Adjutant General to attend the burial service of a deceased veteran.

13 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 (a) (1) The Adjutant General may organize a uniformed honor guard from 18 the National Guard or the organized militia to attend the burial service of a deceased 19 veteran if:

	(i) The commander of an accredited veterans' organization or a friend or relative of the deceased veteran requests an honor guard to attend the burial service;
4 5	(ii) A uniformed honor guard from the active armed forces or veterans' organization is not available; and
8	(iii) The Adjutant General determines that provision of an honor guard will not have a detrimental effect on the readiness of the National Guard in the event of a State or federal emergency or the employment of a National Guard member.
	(2) If an honor guard from the active armed forces is not available, the Adjutant General may request an honor guard from a veterans' organization to attend the burial service of a deceased veteran.
13 14	(b) Reasonable compensation of honor guard members shall be set by the Adjutant General, but not to exceed THE GREATER OF:
15 16	(1) 75% of 1 day's basic pay, plus other expenses incurred to participate in the burial service of a deceased veteran; OR
	(2) THE MINIMUM WAGE REQUIRED UNDER § 3-414 3-413 OF THE LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT ARTICLE, PLUS OTHER EXPENSES INCURRED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE BURIAL SERVICE OF A DECEASED VETERAN.
20	(c) The Adjutant General shall adopt regulations to implement this section.
21 22	SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect October 1, 2000.
