### Preamble

12 WHEREAS, American women of every race, class, and ethnic background have 13 made historic contributions to the growth and strength of the State in countless and 14 unrecorded ways; and

WHEREAS, American women have played and continue to play a critical
economic, social, and cultural role in every sphere of life in the State by constituting
a significant portion of the labor force working inside and outside of the home; and

18 WHEREAS, American women have played and continue to play a significant19 role in protecting and preserving the State's environmental resources; and

WHEREAS, Despite these contributions, the role of American women in history has been consistently overlooked and undervalued in literature and the teaching, and study of American history; and

WHEREAS, In 1981, the United States Congress first designated the week ofMarch 7, 1982, as Women's History Week; and

1 WHEREAS, In 1987, the United States Congress approved the National

2 Women's History Month Resolution to expand the national celebration of women's

3 history to the entire month of March; and

WHEREAS, Since then, the United States Congress has annually approved this
Resolution with bipartisan support, and the President of the United States has
annually proclaimed March as Women's History Month; and

WHEREAS, Advocates, parents, and community organizations in thousands of
American communities have acknowledged National Women's History Month as a
focus of celebration; and

10 WHEREAS, No month is set aside in the State to observe and honor women's 11 historical contributions to the State; now, therefore,

SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OFMARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

17 (A) IN RECOGNITION OF THE HISTORICAL CONTRIBUTIONS THAT WOMEN
18 HAVE MADE TO THE STATE, THE GOVERNOR SHALL PROCLAIM THE MONTH OF
19 MARCH EACH YEAR AS WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH.

20 (B) THE PROCLAMATION SHALL URGE EDUCATIONAL AND CULTURAL 21 ORGANIZATIONS TO OBSERVE WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH PROPERLY WITH 22 APPROPRIATE PROGRAMS, CEREMONIES, AND ACTIVITIES.

23 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect24 October 1, 2000.
