CHAPTER _____

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Memorial Day - Moment of Silence**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Governor to each year issue a proclamation
4 encouraging the citizens of Maryland and certain entities to observe a moment
5 of silence at a certain time on Memorial Day to unite in remembrance and
6 commemorate the acts and efforts of Marylanders who have served and died in
7 the United States Armed Forces.

13 Preamble

14 WHEREAS, Memorial Day has been celebrated in this country since May 1866
15 as a way of honoring and remembering the sacrifices of those brave soldiers who gave
16 their lives in defense of their country; and

17 WHEREAS, Memorial Day was intended as a day of personal remembrance; and

18 WHEREAS, 62,000 Maryland men and women served their country in World
19 War I, 147,000 Maryland men and women served in World War II, and tens of

1 thousands of additional Marylanders served in the Korean, Vietnam, and Persian
2 Gulf conflicts; and

3 WHEREAS, Nationally, 498,332 Americans died in the Civil War, 116,516
4 Americans died in World War I, 405,399 died in World War II, 54,246 died in Korea,
5 58,167 died in Vietnam, and 293 died in the Persian Gulf; and

6 WHEREAS, In this hectic modern age, in the midst of our constant rush, we
7 often fail to take the time to remember those who served our country and died while
8 doing so; now, therefore,

9 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
10 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

11 **Article - State Government**

12 13-404.

13 EACH YEAR, THE GOVERNOR SHALL ISSUE A PROCLAMATION ENCOURAGING
14 THE CITIZENS OF THE STATE OF MARYLAND, THE MEDIA, GOVERNMENT
15 DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES, AND BUSINESS AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES TO
16 OBSERVE A MOMENT OF SILENCE AT 3 P.M. ON MEMORIAL DAY TO UNITE IN
17 REMEMBRANCE AND COMMEMORATE THE HEROIC ACTS AND EFFORTS OF
18 MARYLANDERS WHO HAVE SERVED AND DIED IN THE UNITED STATES ARMED
19 FORCES.

20 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
21 October 1, 2000.
