BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 20 **Article - Business Occupations and Professions** 21 9-101.

In this title the following words have the meanings indicated.

1 (b) "Board" means the State Board of Examiners of Landscape Architects. 2 ["Landscape architect" means an individual who practices landscape (c) 3 architecture] "DESIGN COORDINATION" MEANS THE REVIEW AND COORDINATION OF 4 TECHNICAL SUBMISSIONS PREPARED BY OTHERS IN CONNECTION WITH A 5 LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE PROJECT. "License" means, unless the context requires otherwise, a license issued by 6 (d) 7 the Board to practice landscape architecture. "Licensed landscape architect" means a landscape architect who is licensed 9 by the Board to practice landscape architecture. 10 (f) "Permit" means a permit issued by the Board to allow a partnership [or], 11 corporation, LIMITED LIABILITY COMPANY, OR OTHER BUSINESS ENTITY to operate a 12 business through which an individual may practice landscape architecture. 13 (g) "Practice landscape architecture" means: (1) 14 [to plan, to design, to prepare drawings and specifications, to 15 consult, or to provide any other professional service, including responsible 16 supervision, in connection with the development of land if the principal purpose of the 17 service is: 18 1. to determine, to enhance, or to preserve land uses, natural 19 land features, plantings, or settings and approaches to structures or other 20 improvements: 21 2. to determine an environmental problem of land, including 22 erosion, blight, or other hazard; 23 3. to set a grade; 24 4. to determine drainage; or 25 5. subject to any standards that the State or a local authority 26 sets, to provide for a storm drainage system that does not require a hydraulic or 27 structural design of system components; or] TO PROVIDE ANY SERVICE OR CREATIVE 28 WORK IN THE ANALYSIS OR DESIGN OF LAND AND WATER RESOURCES THAT 29 REQUIRES TRAINING AND EXPERIENCE IN THE APPLICATION OF THE BIOLOGICAL, 30 PHYSICAL, MATHEMATICAL, AND SOCIAL SCIENCES; AND [to design an object or feature that is incidental and necessary 31 (ii) 32 to a service described in item (i) of this paragraph] THE COORDINATION OF SERVICES 33 RELATED TO LANDSCAPE ARCHITECTURE PROVIDED BY OTHERS IN CONNECTION 34 WITH A PROJECT OR PORTION OF A PROJECT INTENDED FOR PUBLIC USE AND 35 AFFECTING PUBLIC SAFETY.
