A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Kent County - Alcoholic Beverages - Caterer's License**

3 FOR the purpose of allowing in Kent County a holder of a Class B restaurant or hotel
4 (on-sale) beer and light wine license to be issued a caterer's license; and
5 generally relating to caterer's licenses in Kent County.

6 BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,
7 Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages

10 (1998 Replacement Volume and 1999 Supplement)

11 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
12 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

13 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

14 6-705.

15 (a) This section applies only in Kent County.

16 (b) The annual license fee is \$100.

17 (c) The Board of License Commissioners may issue a caterer's license to a
18 holder of:

19 (1) [a] A Class B restaurant or hotel (on-sale) beer, wine and liquor
20 license; AND

21 (2) A CLASS B RESTAURANT OR HOTEL (ON-SALE) BEER AND LIGHT
22 WINE LICENSE.

23 (d) A caterer's license issued under this section authorizes the holder to
24 provide alcoholic beverages at events that are held off the Class B restaurant or hotel
25 (on-sale) beer, wine and liquor license premises.

1 (e) The holder shall provide food as well as alcoholic beverages for
2 consumption at the catered event.

3 (f) A holder may exercise the privileges under this license only during the
4 hours and days that are permitted in this article for a Class B restaurant or hotel
5 (on-sale) beer, wine and liquor license.

6 (g) This section does not require a holder of an existing Class B (on-sale) beer,
7 wine and liquor license to have a caterer's license for catering on the premises that is
8 covered by the existing license.

9 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
10 October 1, 2000.
