5 (a) The Council is established to assist in the prevention and deterrence of 6 private passenger and commercial motor vehicle theft and related crimes including 7 vandalism and the theft of property from vehicles in the State.

8 (b) The Council shall have the following powers and duties:

9 (1) To make grants and awards from the Fund for motor vehicle theft 10 intervention programs, as provided in § 74 of this subtitle;

11 (2) To solicit and accept funds, for deposit to the Fund, to be used to carry 12 out the purposes of this subtitle;

13 (3) To establish or assist in the establishment of programs designed to 14 reduce the incidence of vehicle thefts and related crimes;

15 (4) To identify priorities for theft prevention strategies in the State and 16 criteria for the Council's evaluation of recipients of assistance from the Council; and

17 (5) To study and propose laws that will further prevent and deter vehicle 18 thefts and related crimes.
