2 **Anne Arundel County - Board of License Commissioners - ~~Administrators~~**
3 **Personnel**

4 FOR the purpose of authorizing the Board of License Commissioners for Anne
5 Arundel County to hire up to a certain number of full-time administrators at a
6 certain salary pay grade; *increasing to a certain amount the number of liquor*
7 *inspectors for the County*; and generally relating to the Board of License
8 Commissioners for Anne Arundel County.

4 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
 5 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

6 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

7 15-112.

8 (c) (1) This subsection applies only in Anne Arundel County. Except for
 9 paragraph (2) of this subsection, it does not apply in the City of Annapolis.

10 (2) (i) This paragraph applies only in the City of Annapolis.

11 (ii) The Mayor, Counsellor and Aldermen of Annapolis may make
 12 and enforce regulations and restrictions, in addition to, or in substitution of, those
 13 contained in this article, but not inconsistent therewith, as in their judgment would
 14 give the municipality more effective control of each of the places of business.

15 (3) In addition to the powers given to the Board in subsection (a) of this
 16 section, the Board may employ one part-time chief inspector at an annual salary of
 17 \$8,000, and [12] 16 part-time inspectors at an annual salary of \$5,000 each. In
 18 addition to this salary, each of the inspectors shall receive a monthly expense of \$150
 19 per month, subject to the approval of the State Comptroller.

20 (4) The [13] 17 inspectors shall:

21 (i) Have all the powers of a peace officer or a constable or sheriff of
 22 this State;

23 (ii) Make oath to faithfully perform the duties entrusted to them, as
 24 provided in Article I, § 9 of the Constitution of this State; and

25 (iii) Furnish bond in the penalty of \$2,000 to the Board and the
 26 County Council jointly, conditioned "that inspector shall well and faithfully execute the
 27 office in all things appertaining thereto". The cost of the bond shall be paid by the
 28 County. The inspectors for Anne Arundel County are known as the "liquor inspectors
 29 for Anne Arundel County".

30 (5) [There is] THE BOARD OF LICENSE COMMISSIONERS:

31 (i) [A full-time administrator to the Board] MAY EMPLOY UP TO
 32 TWO FULL-TIME ADMINISTRATORS whose annual [salary] SALARIES shall be fixed
 33 by the Board as in a general Anne Arundel County classified salary schedule, within
 34 pay grade 16;

1 (ii) [A] SHALL EMPLOY A full-time secretary [to the Board] whose
2 annual salary shall be fixed by the Board as in a general county classified salary
3 schedule, within pay grade 13; and

4 (iii) [An] SHALL EMPLOY AN attorney [to the Board,] at an annual
5 salary of \$8,000.

6 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
7 October 1, 2000.
