- 26 (A) EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, BEFORE
- 27 OCTOBER 1, 2005, A PERSON MAY NOT EXPAND SWINE PRODUCTION OVER 250 SWINE
- 28 OR CONDUCT NEW SWINE PRODUCTION.

- 5 (A) THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE SHALL STUDY THE IMPACT OF

- 8 (B) THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT SHALL STUDY
- 9 COMPREHENSIVELY THE ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS OF INTENSIVE ANIMAL
- 10 PRODUCTION SYSTEMS, PARTICULARLY THE EFFECTS ON THE STATE'S WATER

- 12 (C) THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND MENTAL HYGIENE SHALL STUDY THE
- 13 IMPACT OF INTENSIVE ANIMAL PRODUCTION SYSTEMS ON HUMAN HEALTH AND
- 14 FOOD SAFETY, PARTICULARLY THE EFFECTS OF THE USE OF ANTIBIOTICS AND
- 15 HEAVY METALS IN ANIMAL FEED.
- 16 (D) ON OR BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 2002, THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE,
- 17 THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ENVIRONMENT, AND THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND
- 18 MENTAL HYGIENE SHALL SUBMIT SEPARATELY A REPORT OF THEIR FINDINGS TO

- 36 HYGIENE OR THE SECRETARY'S DESIGNEE; AND

- 19 THE SECRETARY MAY IMPOSE A CIVIL FINE OF NOT MORE THAN \$100 PER UNIT 20 OF TWO SWINE IN VIOLATION OF § 3-701 OF THIS SUBTITLE.
- 21 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 22 October 1, 2000.
